



We are proud of our accomplishments; however, our success is because of your support of our fundraising events, your donations and the support of the Barbados hotels who have donated generously to the live and silent auctions at *Bring On The Spring's* inception. Thank you all, your generous support helps to improve and save the lives of family and friends in Barbados.

Tonight's live and silent auctions and raffle will include amazing prizes, and I urge you to bid on these items vigorously and to participate in the raffle. Funds raised will assist us in achieving our goal.

Message from David Gibbs Consul, The Consulate General of Barbados at Toronto

The Consulate General of Barbados at Toronto is delighted to extend its support to the Barbados Canada Foundation (BCF) as it hosts the 2025 edition of Bring On the Spring. This event, which is celebrating its seventh anniversary, has become arguably the leading annual fundraiser in support of Barbados held by a

Barbadian organization in the diaspora.

The BCF has focused much of its energies on the critical area of tertiary level health care at the state-owned Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Barbados. To date the Foundation has donated twenty-two pieces of equipment valued at BBD\$320,000. This year it is seeking to raise CAD\$79,000 towards the donation of 20 hospital beds costing BBD\$109,800.

Philanthropic initiatives such as Bring on the Spring reflect two important guiding principles on which Barbados' diaspora diplomacy is based. Firstly, they highlight the importance of active citizenship, which is most viable when it adds value to the development of family, community and the nation. Such citizenship transcends mere individual concerns and focuses on the collective - 'I am because we are,' as expressed by the African concept of Ubuntu which recognizes that it is the collective that makes the difference.

Secondly such initiatives are testimony to the reality that Barbados' development prospects cannot be realized solely by the 275, 000 citizens residing in Barbados. Rather the resources and expertise of the approximately 250,000 members of the Barbados diaspora, including the 40,000 Barbadians that reside in Canada, are indispensable components if Barbados is to realize its potential. The approximately \$28 million remitted to Barbados annually by Barbadians in Canada is a simple example of how diasporic resources can enhance the quality of life of ordinary Barbadians.



#### 60 YEARS OF SERVICE TO BARBADOS AND THE EASTERN CARIBBEAN



or just over a year, I have been honored to be the Chair of the BCF Scholarships Program Committee and to work collaboratively with committee members, sponsors, applicants, scholarship application assessors and other stakeholders.

In 2024, we received twenty-five applications from students engaged in a wide range of academic areas of study at Canadian universities and colleges. Eleven students were awarded scholarships and were recognized at our annual Awards Ceremony in October. Ninety-six (96) scholarships valued at \$347,000 have been granted to date.

These scholarships help the recipients further their studies and are possible because of the generous donations from our scholarship sponsors and individual donors to Barbados Canada Foundation. In this regard I would like to thank our sponsors: Barbados Overseas Community Canada, Bass Installation Ltd, Blue Circle Energy, Gloria Baylis Foundation and Diproinduca Canada Ltd. Sponsorship is an important component of our funding, and I would be pleased to speak with any individual or corporation who may be interested in learning more about our scholarship program, or who may be considering funding a scholarship to honour a family member or friend.

Scholarships of \$4,000 each are available to



Each scholarship grant will be paid directly to the university or college being attended by the recipient, who must have a Social Insurance Number to facilitate compliance with Canada Revenue Agency reporting requirements.

DR. CONNELL IS A SCHOLAR, ACADEMIC INTERNIST/HYPERTENSION SPECIALIST, and public health policy activist. He is currently full-time tenured-faculty as Senior Lecturer (Associate Professor equivalent) in Clinical Pharmacology in the Department of Preclinical & Health Sciences, Faculty of Medical Sciences, Cave Hill Campus, The UWI. He holds the portfolio of Deputy Dean of Recruitment & Research.

Dr. Connell received his undergraduate and postgraduate training in medicine from the UWI St. Augustine & Cave Hill Campuses and graduated with MBBS and DM Internal Medicine degrees in 2000 and 2006 respectively. He was awarded a Barbados National Development Scholarship in 2007. He was awarded his Doctor of Philosophy degree on completion of studies from King's College London. He joined the Faculty of Medical Sciences as Lecturer in Clinical Pharmacology in 2011 and assumed duties of Deputy Dean- Phase 1 in August 2014.

Dr. Connell is a Consultant Physician at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital and is Consultant-in-Charge of the hospital's Resistant Hypertension clinic.

He is also a member of the QEH's Drug & Therapeutics committee and Chair of the Specially Authorized Drugs (SAD) committee. He is a past member of the Barbados Medical Council, of the Ministry of Health, and is Chairman of the Drug & Therapeutics Committee of the Barbados Ministry of Health and Wellness.

Dr. Connell is the current President of the Healthy Caribbean Coalition, the CARICOM mandated civil society organization aimed at advancing the regions mandate of reducing the burden of non—communicable diseases (NCDS) as outlined in the 2008 Port of Spain Declaration. He is a former President of the Heart & Stroke Foundation of Barbados from March 2011-2017.

Dr. Connell was the Principal Investigator on the US CDC/PAHO Standardized Hypertension Treatment Project - Barbados pilot from April 2014- April 2016. This pilot expanded into the WHO-PAHO Global HEARTS Initiatives; an intervention aimed at improving hypertension control rates in primary care. HEARTS has been implemented in more than 30 countries worldwide

Dr. Connell is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians (ACP), the largest international College of doctors. He was elected as the youngest Governor for the ACP as Governor of the new Caribbean Chapter in 2015 for two years term.

In 2014, Dr. Connell was awarded the College's International Fellowship for research and collaboration with the University of South Carolina. He is a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians (FRCP) and local Chief Examiner for the Royal College Physician MRCP examinations.

For his contributions to hypertension and cardiovascular science, he was invited to Fellowship of the American College of Cardiology (FACC).

#### KEVIN CARRNGTON SHOST





# WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT FRAUDS AND SCAMS IN CANADA

AND HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF



Association of Retired Persons (CARP) has voiced growing concerns about the inadequacy of laws and punishments for those convicted of perpetrating frauds and scams against seniors. Scams vary in nature, but deception by email, text and phone call is very common. Scams in person may also occur.

Here are the scams experienced by many unsuspecting seniors:

## • Identity theft

Identity theft occurs when a con artist steals personal information from someone so they can pretend to be that person and then do things like apply for a credit card, take out a loan or mortgage, get a cell phone or withdraw bank funds. The con artist will try to get information such as a bank card number and personal identity number (PIN), credit card number, health card number, driver's license and Social Insurance Number (SIN).

Many scams and frauds attempt to imitate government services in order to gain access to your personal and financial information. You may receive false messages from Service Canada, Canada Revenue Agency, Immigration, Refugees, Citizenship Canada, or Canada Border Services Agency, Canada Post.

#### • Credit/debit card fraud

Credit card and debit card fraud occurs when a con artist uses your card, or a copy, to make purchases or withdraw money from your account. Keeping your card in sight, memorizing your PIN, and shielding your hand when you enter your PIN are ways you can reduce the risk of your credit card or debit card information being stolen and misused.

• Digital scams (websites, email or text)
There are many digital scams, and new ones appear all the time. Some appear to be asking for your help; some say there is a problem with your bank account or tax return. If you are not sure about an e-mail or text, stop and verify. Do not open attachments or click on links, and do not provide personal or financial information. You can check that any telephone number provided is the same as others found online or check to see if there are scam reported that sound similar to what you are experiencing via CAFC.

#### • Phone and door-to-door scams

Phone and door-to-door scams are also very common. Someone will call or come to your door pretending to be a representative of a charity, an employee of a credit card company, or even a distant relative. You might be offered a free prize or trip. If you aren't completely sure who you are dealing with, do not give the person any money or information.

Sometimes people call or come to your door using high-pressure sales tactics to get you to buy something you don't want or need, or to talk you into getting work done on your house and then overcharging you or doing a bad job. While this is not always illegal, it is wrong and should be reported.

## How You Can Protect Yourself

• Keep tabs on current frauds and learn more about how to protect yourself or report scammers through the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre.

- Keep all personal documents in a secure place. If you don't need them, do not carry your birth certificate, passport or SIN card.
- Never tell another person your PIN or account passwords and take care to cover your hand when entering your PIN at bank machines and when making store purchases.
- Safely dispose of old bills and statements—shredding is best.
- Do not click on pop-up windows or respond to e-mails, open attachments or go to website links sent by people you do not know. Your bank or credit union will not send you anything by e-mail unless you ask them to.
- Never give out your credit card, bank account, or personal information to someone over the phone, at the door, or over the Internet unless you know the person or organization you are dealing with, or you made the contact.
- If your wallet is lost or stolen, or mail you are expecting goes missing, you should report it right away to your bank or credit union.
- Do not sign an agreement or contract to buy anything without giving yourself time to think it over. If a salesperson insists that an "offer" is "time limited" and you must decide that moment, it is probably better not to buy.
- Be suspicious if someone you don't know asks you to send them money or a cheque, or to return money they "accidentally" sent you.
- Before hiring someone or agreeing to have work done on your home, ask for proof of identity and references and check them.

## BREAKING BARRIERS, BUILDING LEGACIES

THE STORY OF STEPHEN CALLENDER AND NATASHA CALLENDER-WILSON

you find yourself gazing at Toronto's skyline, take a moment to appreciate the towering glass facades that define the city. Behind some of them lies the skill, determination and legacy of Stephen Callender and his daughter, Natasha Callender-Wilson two trailblazers whose mark is etched not just in steel and glass, but in the breaking of barriers for Black entrepreneurs in the construction industry. From the TD Canada Trust Tower on Front Street to the St. Regis Hotel to the Bank of Montreal's First Canadian Place, their work tells a story of resilience, vision and a deep commitment to building something greater than themselves.

Stephen Callender's journey is a testament to grit, integrity and vision. Born and raised in Lower Carlton, St James, Barbados, Stephen attended the St Alban's Primary School and then the Coleridge and Parry. He worked at the Labour Department for about two years before emigrating to Canada in 1976 shortly before his 20th birthday, stepping into a world where opportunities were scarce for Black workers, especially in the trades.

His first job in Canada was on Barbados Boulevard in Scarborough, working at a window factory. Looking back, he now sees the poetic connection—his career began in

a window factory on Barbados Boulevard and, today, he, a Barbadian, owns a glass company, BASS Installation. These fullcircle moments reinforce his belief that everything in life is connected.

Determined to elevate himself, Stephen pursued higher education. He attended York University to learn computer science but quit his studies after two years when Natasha was born with the intention of returning to York. He didn't, instead opting to enroll in electronics and computer classes at Humber College. He actually started a business building and selling computers and writing computer programs. Juggling a young family, work, school and the computer business became overwhelming. This became a turning point for him. While he considered a career in the field of computer programming, construction had become his calling, and he was fully committed to it.

Stephen navigated the deeply entrenched racism of the industry with a steadfast resolve—understanding that if he could not go through the obstacles, he would find a way around them. His knowledge, skill and unwavering integrity quickly earned him the respect of his peers, helping him rise through the ranks from apprentice to foreman.

Yet, Stephen knew that true success was not just about personal achievement—it was about opening doors for others. When he co-founded his first construction company in 1992, the foundation was built on a single word: integrity. Over the years, he expanded and strengthened the business, eventually growing it into BASS Installation, adding a second firm, BASS Curtainwall, which Natasha managed. These companies now stand as symbols of Black excellence in the construction industry. Through all of this, he remained committed to uplifting others, mentoring young Black professionals and advocating for greater diversity in the trades. One of Stephen's greatest legacies is his daughter, Natasha Callender-Wilson. From childhood, she was immersed in the world

of construction, not as an outsider but as a participant. Encouraged by her father's ethos of curiosity and hands-on learning, Natasha grew up taking apart and rebuilding machines, visiting construction sites and experiencing the power of creation. She fell in love with being able to build something, fitting things together where there was value and purpose.

She vividly remembers, when she was around 12 years, going with her dad to the TD Canada Trust where he was working. They took the elevator to the 56th floor and she remembers exiting onto the floor slab and watched the crew who were installing the frames and putting in the glass curtainwall systems. She thought to herself, "Oh my gosh, this is so cool. How can I get to do this."

"I fell in love with it — the height, the adrenaline rush, knowing that you are building something from nothing," she added, stating that she admired her dad even more. From that moment "it was in her blood". However, she didn't fully understand then the difficulties of getting into the union as a Black woman. Therefore, when it came time for her to further her studies, her father

persuaded her to "go to college or university and get an education".

She decided to pursue a career in finance and enrolled at Humber College where she gained a certificate, after which she earned a business degree from York University. All the while she continued to work in the family business, bringing with her a strategic and structured approach that would transform BASS into a stronger, more resilient company.

In November 2024, Stephen made the bold and deliberate decision to appoint Natasha as CEO of BASS Installation, an announcement made fittingly on Barbados' Independence Day. It was not a symbolic gesture—it was a recognition of the work she had already been doing for over two decades.

Natasha had stood by her father through economic downturns, cash flow crises, and industry shifts, proving time and again that she had the vision and capability to lead. Her promotion sent a powerful message to the industry: Black women belong at the highest levels of leadership in construction.

Together, Stephen and Natasha have embedded the values of diversity, equity and inclusion into their company long before it became an industry buzzword. They have created a workplace culture that prioritizes mentorship, education support and a family environment for employees. Their monthly cultural luncheons, scholarship contributions to the Barbados Canada Foundation and active involvement in the African Canadian Contractors Association (ACCA) are all testaments to their unwavering commitment to the Black community.

Beyond business, Stephen's altruistic nature has driven him to create spaces where Black professionals in construction can thrive. As President of ACCA and Secretary/Treasurer of the Toronto Community Benefits Network (TCBN), he has worked tirelessly to break down systemic barriers

that have historically kept Black contractors on the fringes of the industry. His advocacy is not just about representation—it is about creating lasting change, ensuring that young Black tradespeople find pathways to success, mentorship and ownership.

Natasha, balancing her role as wife, mother of a 13-year-old daughter, community leader and CEO, continues to push BASS forward with innovation and a deep sense of responsibility. She understands the weight of her role—not just as a business leader and homemaker but as a trailblazer for Black women in a space where they have been historically excluded. Her leadership is a reminder that when given the opportunity, Black women do not just take seats at the table—they build the table.

Looking ahead, BASS is charting an ambitious path for growth. While the company has solidified its reputation for installation, the next evolution involves expanding into procurement. Instead of simply installing glass systems, BASS aims to secure contracts that include sourcing materials as well, creating a vertically integrated model. This shift will allow them to compete at a higher level in the industry, giving them greater control over projects and expanding their business reach.

Stephen and Natasha recognize that growth comes with challenges, but they are committed to learning, adapting and continuing to push the boundaries of what is possible. They remain steadfast in their mission to create opportunities, not only for their own company but for the broader Black community in construction.

The story of Stephen Callender and Natasha Callender-Wilson is one of perseverance, vision and legacy. As their company continues to grow, so too does their impact—shaping the skyline of Toronto and the future of Black entrepreneurship and leadership in Canada.

## WHAT YOUSHOULD KNOW

IF YOU WISH TO OWN OR OWN PROPERTY IN BARBADOS

f you wish to own property in Barbados it is essential that you do the following:

## • Obtain permission from the Central Bank of Barbados (if applicable).

Non-residents should obtain permission from the Central Bank. Central Bank's approval is generally granted as a formality. Your attorney will manage this process on your behalf. Foreign exchange brought in Barbados should be registered with the Central Bank during this process.

## f you wish to own property in Barbados it is essential that you do Central Bank of Barbados.

Registration of foreign currency on the purchase of the property enables the owner to repatriate funds from Barbados upon sale of the property.

### Conduct thorough due diligence on the property.

Research, research, research, to ensure it is a sound investment. Look into the property's history, verify the title, and obtain a valuation report.

## • Engage a local attorney with expertise in property law.

It is essential to engage a local Barbados attorney with expertise in Barbados property law to guide you through the process. The attorney will help draft the sales agreement, conduct a title search, and manage the conveyancing process, to ensure all legal requirements are met.

## • Negotiate and sign a sales agreement. A sales agreement will be drafted by the attorney(s) based on the agreement

between the parties.

• Pay the required deposit and complete the conveyancing process.

On the signing of the sales agreement, a deposit, usually 10 per cent of the purchase price, is paid to the vendor's attorney. This deposit is held in escrow until the transaction is finalized. If the purchaser fails to complete the agreement, the deposit "may" be forfeited.

The purchaser's attorney will conduct a title search to ensure the vendor is who he/she says they are with rights to the property and to ensure that the property is free of any encumbrances or liens. The necessary documents for transferring the title will then be prepared for execution by the parties.

## Register the property title with the Land Registry.

On completion of the conveyancing process, the balance of the purchase price is paid to the vendor's attorney, and the new property title registered with the Land Registry. This requires all necessary fees and submitting the required documents, including the signed conveyance and deed of sale. Once complete, the property will be registered in the new purchaser's name.

• Finalize the transaction and settle all outstanding taxes and fees.

Registration is complete. Any taxes and fees associated with the transaction are paid, and the attorney will provide the purchaser with the registered title deed, signifying legal ownership of the property.


#### Legal and Notary Fees

Legal and Notary fees associated with property transactions typically range from 1.75% to 2.5% of the purchase price, depending on the sale/purchase price and the complexity of the transaction.

### · Consider tax and estate planning.

This may have implications for how to structure the holding of the property, as well as how that property is transferred or disposed of in Will drafting and estate planning.

If you already own property in Barbados, please:



- Ensure that annual land taxes are paid in a timely manner to avoid penalties for overdue payment.
- Pay close attention to the value of the property and ensure that any building(s) on your land is insured for its actual replacement value well in advance of the hurricane season.
- Be aware that maintenance costs can be significant. Consider hiring a property management service. Avoid relying solely on family and friends.
- Do not allow the property(ies) to fall into and become "derelict." The Barbados Government is instituting a process of (1) cleaning up the properties and charging the owners, (2) collaborating with owners to buy said properties making the land available to build affordable housing. (currently there are approximately 15,000 derelict properties and 10,000 vacant lots)
- Plan to have the properties maintained, de-bushed etc. This reduces the chances of squatters occupying the property and having to incur future costs to have them removed.
